



## THE NEW DEAL: A LEGACY OF PUBLIC WORKS IN IDAHO

Beginning in 1933, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt established a series of national relief programs – known collectively as the New Deal – that left their mark on our nation. Major programs like the Rural Electrification Administration, Social Security Administration, Agricultural Adjustment Act, and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation were created to provide a social safety net and help the millions of Americans affected by the Great Depression.

Two of those programs, the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) and the Works

Progress Administration (WPA), left an imprint on our national landscape. Thousands of young men came from other states to Idaho as CCC workers to build roads, bridges, buildings, trails, lookouts, and airstrips on our vast public lands. In communities around the state, local workers and professionals were employed on WPA projects, designing and constructing public buildings and infrastructure, painting works of art, and writing books, among other things.

Take a look around: Your school, courthouse, or road may be a piece of New Deal

history in Idaho. Did the Great Depression programs leave a legacy in your community?

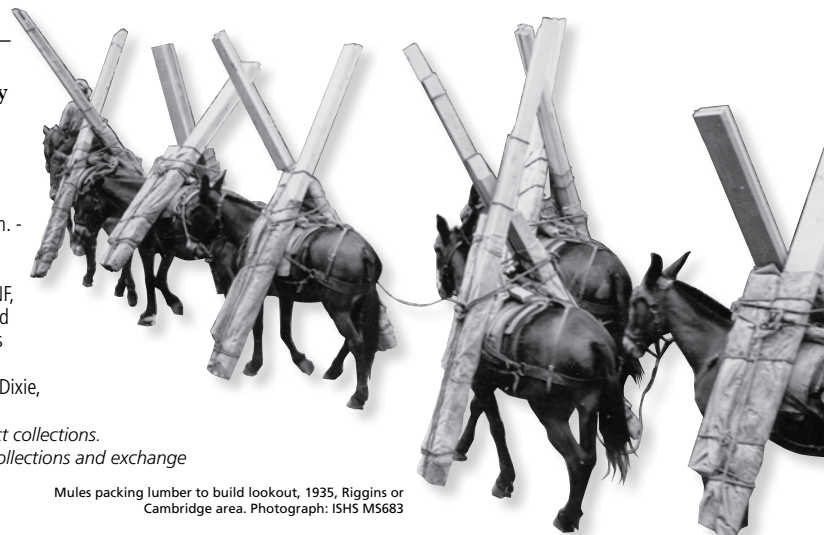
