

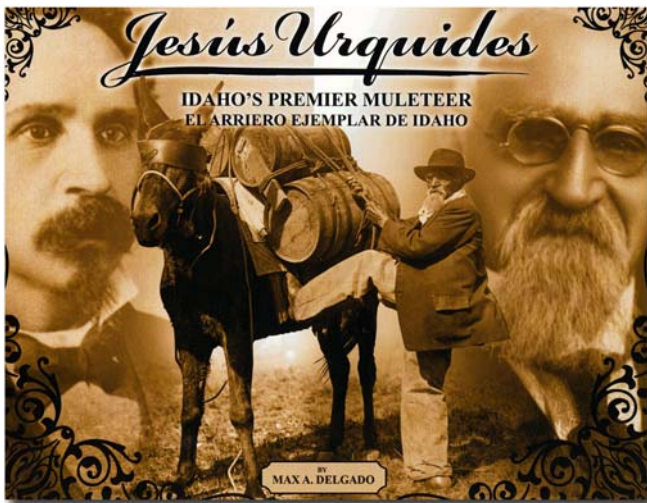
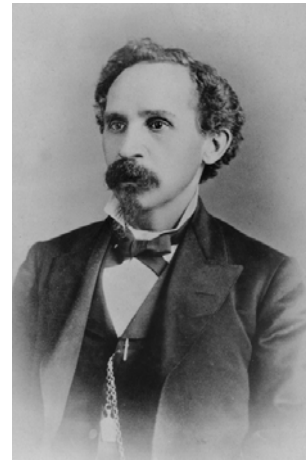
# Jesús Urquides Idaho's Premier Muleteer

An illustrated, bilingual book about one of Idaho's earliest Mexican American pioneers is now available from the Idaho State Historical Society and the Hispanic Cultural Center of Idaho. Jesús Urquides was born in the state of Sonora, Mexico in 1833, and ran mule trains to mining camps throughout California and the Northwest. He moved to Boise in the 1860s, where he raised his family in a Mexican neighborhood at one end of Main Street. After his death in 1928, his daughter Lola Urquides Binnard maintained the family home, known as "Spanish Village," for another forty years. The book highlights other Mexican American pioneer families as well, including miner Manuel Fontes and his wife Gumecinda Torres.
